

CHAPTER 15

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Part 1

General Regulations

§101. Definitions and Interpretation.

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for Sections or Parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Vehicle Code (the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81), as amended, except that, in this Chapter, the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
2. The term "legal holidays" as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day.
3. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.

§102. Manner of Adopting Permanent Traffic and Parking Regulations.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this Chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less-formal action. The City Council may, by resolution, adopt new hours of operation for all parking meters within the City of Saint Marys.

§103. Provisions to be Continuation of Existing Regulations.

The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.

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§104. Temporary and Emergency Regulations.

1. The City shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations; and
 - B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than 72 hours.
2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25, together with costs of prosecution.

§105. Experimental Regulations.

The City may, from time to time by resolution, designate places upon and along the highways in the City of St. Marys where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulation, prohibition or restriction, and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this Section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25, together with costs of prosecution; provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the City of St. Marys relative to traffic and parking.

§106. Traffic on Streets Closed or Restricted for Construction, Maintenance or Special Events.

1. The City shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.
2. The City shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flagmen at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.
3. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25, and costs.

§107. Use of Streets by Processions and Assemblages.

1. For the purpose of this Section, the words "assemblage" and "procession" shall have the following meanings:

ASSEMBLAGE – a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

PROCESSION – a group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains a permit from the City, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least one week in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held; but in any case where a state-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least three weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall state the place where and the date when the assemblage is to be held, the hour when the assemblage may convene and the hour by which it shall have been completely dispersed. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any assemblage unless the permit has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the permit.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains a permit from the

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City, which shall be issued without fee. Application for the permit shall be made at least two weeks in advance of the day when the procession is proposed to be held; but in any case where a state-designated highway is proposed to be used, application shall be made at least six weeks in advance of the proposed date. The permit shall specify the date on which the procession is to be held, the route to be followed by the procession, the hour when and place where participants may commence to assemble and form before the procession is underway, the time when the procession may commence to move along its route, and the time by which the end of the procession shall have reached the end of the route of the procession and the procession shall have been disbanded. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless the permit shall have been granted, or under any conditions as to time or route or otherwise than those stated in the permit.

4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25, and costs.

§108. Authority of Police Officers.

The police officers of the City of St. Marys are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the City of St. Marys and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter.

§109. Authorization for Use of Speed Timing Devices.

The City of St. Marys Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed-timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with Title 75, Pa. C.S.A. §3368.

This Section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the City of St. Marys, be they City of St. Marys, county or state highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6101 et seq. (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

Part 2
Traffic Regulations

§201. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Streets.

1. Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle, on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

§202. Maximum Speed Limits Established on Certain Bridges and Elevated Structures.

- Maximum speed limits are established, as follows, on certain bridges and elevated structures, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any such bridge or elevated structure, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that bridge or elevated structure:

- Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00). Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five (5) miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of two dollars (\$2.00) per mile for each mile in excess of five (5) miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

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§203. Maximum Speed Limits Established for Certain Vehicles on Hazardous Grades.

1. The following are declared to be hazardous grades, and, upon any such hazardous grade, no person shall drive a vehicle, having a gross weight in excess of that referred to for that grade, in the direction stated for that grade, at a speed in excess of that established in this Section for that grade, and, if so stated for a particular grade, the driver of every such vehicle shall stop the vehicle before proceeding downhill:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00). Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five (5) miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of two dollars (\$2.00) for each mile in excess of five (5) miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§204. Maximum Speed Limits Established in Parks.

1. A speed limit of fifteen (15) miles per hour is established on all streets and roadways in the public parks maintained and operated by the City of St. Marys, except in the following locations, where the lower maximums, as specified, shall apply:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of thirty-five dollars (\$35.00). Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five (5) miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of two dollars (\$2.00) per mile for each mile in excess of five (5) miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§205. Traffic Signals at Certain Locations.

1. At the following locations, traffic signals as indicated below shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected), and traffic at those locations shall be directed by those signals:

2. Any driver of a vehicle who disobeys the directions of any traffic signal shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and costs.

§206. Intersections Where Turn Prohibited on Red Signal.

1. The following are established as intersections where drivers of vehicles headed in the direction or directions indicated are prohibited from making a right turn (or a left turn from a one-way street into another one-way street) on a steady red signal:

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§207. One-Way Streets Established.

The police officer or parking enforcement officer making the report shall also attach to or place upon every such vehicle a notice stating that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Part. The notice shall contain instructions to the owner or driver of the vehicle that if he/she will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay the appropriate ticket amount, as set forth below, enclosed within the envelope provided, or deposit said envelope with the appropriate payment enclosed in any of the special parking fine boxes installed at various locations within the City, within the time specified in the notice, then there will be no prosecution for a penalty under this Part. For a violation of §406 of this Part, the ticket amount shall be \$5. In all other cases, the ticket amount shall be \$2.

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§408. Penalties.

§502. Hours of Operation.

Hours of operation shall be from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. daily, except Sundays and federal holidays.

§503. Placement and Characteristics of Parking Meters.

Parking meters installed in the parking meter zones established by §501 of this Part shall be placed upon the curb or sidewalk and immediately adjacent to the individual parking spaces described in §504 of this Part. Each parking meter shall be placed or set so as to show that the parking space adjacent to that meter is or is not legally occupied. Each parking meter installed shall indicate by a proper legend the legal parking time established by the City; and when the adjacent space is occupied by a vehicle, the parking meter shall indicate on and by its dial and pointer the duration of the period of legal parking, and, on the expiration of that period, shall indicate illegal parking or over-parking.

§504. Parked Vehicles to be Wholly Within Marked Spaces.

Lines and/or markings shall be painted or placed upon the curb, sidewalk or roadway adjacent to each parking meter for the purpose of delineating the parking space for which that meter shall be used. Every vehicle parked at any parking meter shall be parked wholly within the lines or markings so placed and applicable to that meter. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part for any person to park a vehicle across any such line or marking or to park a vehicle in such a position that that vehicle is not wholly within the area designated by those lines or markings.

§505. Coin Deposit in Meter; Overtime Parking Unlawful.

Whenever a vehicle is to be parked in any space adjacent to a parking meter, at any time in the period of limited parking as prescribed by §502 of this Part, the driver of the vehicle, upon entering the parking space, shall immediately deposit, or cause to be deposited in that parking meter one or more proper coins of the United States of America

or authorized tokens as specified in the legend on the parking meter. Upon the deposit of the coin or coins, token or tokens, and placing the meter in operation, the parking space may be lawfully occupied by the vehicle for the time indicated on the meter. If any vehicle shall remain in any such parking space for such length of time that the meter shall indicate by proper signal that the lawful parking time has expired, that vehicle shall be considered as having been parked overtime, and the parking of a vehicle overtime shall be a violation of this Part.

§506. Unlawful to Deposit Substitute for Coin in Meter.

It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit in any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part any slug or other substitute for a coin of the United States of America.

§507. Unlawful to Deposit Coin in Meter to Extend Parking Time Beyond Legal Limit.

It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part for any person to deposit or cause to be deposited, in any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part, any coin for the purpose of increasing or extending the parking time of any vehicle beyond the legal parking time of 15 minutes in any fifteen-minute parking meter zone, 1/2 hour in any half-hour parking meter zone, one hour in any one-hour parking meter zone, or two hours in any two-hour parking meter zone.

§508. Unlawful to Remain Parked at Meter Showing Violation.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to permit a vehicle to remain in a parking space adjacent to a parking meter installed under this Part when that meter displays a signal indicating that the vehicle has already been parked there beyond the period of time prescribed for that parking space or the time for which a coin or coins was deposited in that meter for the parking of that vehicle.

§509. Unlawful to Tamper with Meter.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to deface, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed

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under the provisions of this Part; provided that nothing in this Section shall apply to the servicing or opening of parking meters by officers, employees or police officers of the City of St. Marys under the direction of the City.

§510. Ticketing of Vehicles Parked Unlawfully; Effect of Payment Within 48 Hours.

1. It shall be the duty of the police officers and parking enforcement personnel of the City of St. Marys, acting in accordance with the directions of the Chief of Police, to report:
 - A. The number of each parking meter that indicates that a vehicle occupying the adjacent parking space is, or has been, parked in violation of any provision of this Part;
 - B. The date and hour of the violation;
 - C. The license number of the vehicle;
 - D. Any other facts, the knowledge of which is necessary for a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending the violation.
2. The police officer or other person making the report shall also place on or attach to the vehicle a notice to the owner or driver of the vehicle that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Part and instructing the owner or driver that, if he will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay, for the use of the City, the sum of \$2 (\$5 for violation of no parking 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. zones) within 48 hours after the time of the notice, or will place the sum of \$2 (\$5 for violation of no parking 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. zones) enclosed within the envelope provided, in any of the special parking fine boxes installed at various locations within the City of St. Marys within that time limit, that act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine prescribed in §511(1) of this Part.

§511. Penalty for Violation.

1. Any person who violates any provision of this Part, with the exception of §509, and who fails to pay the fine set forth in §510, shall be cited within 15 days of the violation and, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15, and costs.

2. Any person who violates any provision of §509 of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600, and costs, and, in default of payment of fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than 30 days.

§512. Exceptions.

1. By resolution, the City Council may temporarily suspend the provisions of this Part by requiring coin deposit in meters and establishing a maximum parking time at meters.
2. The City of St. Marys shall have authority to establish no-parking or special-purpose parking zones within any parking meter zone, and to remove parking meters from those areas as previously installed there; and the provisions of this Part shall not apply in those areas where no-parking or special-purpose parking are in effect.

Part 6

Off-Street Metered Parking

§601. Metered Parking Lots Established.

The following are established as the metered parking lots established by the City of St. Marys, Pennsylvania. Parking fee rates will be set by the St. Marys City Council on the yearly fee schedule.

§602. Placement and Characteristics of Parking Meters.

Parking meters installed in the parking lots shall be placed immediately adjacent to the individual parking spaces that shall be marked off and maintained in the lots. For each parking meter, there shall be a clear indication through use of a directional arrow, or an identification as to number with the parking space, to show which individual parking space it serves. Each parking meter shall indicate by a proper legend the parking rate and the maximum parking time established by St. Marys City Council; and when the parking space is occupied and the parking meter put into operation by the insertion of one or more coins/tokens, the parking meter shall indicate on and by its dial and pointer the duration of legal parking and, upon the expiration of the period, shall indicate illegal parking or over parking.

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§603. Reserved Parking Spaces for Handicapped.

The City of St. Marys has established handicapped parking in each lot in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. All spaces are properly marked and signed. There is no fee charged for these spaces. It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to park in any such reserved parking space, any vehicle unless that vehicle bears or displays either a handicapped registration plate, a handicapped parking placard, a disabled veteran registration plate, or a disabled veteran placard.

§604. Parked Vehicles to be Wholly Within Marked Spaces.

Lines and/or markings shall be painted or placed upon the surface of the metered parking lots, adjacent to each parking meter, for the purpose of delineating the parking space for which that meter shall be used. Every vehicle parked adjacent to any parking meter shall be parked wholly within the lines or markings so placed and applicable to that meter. It shall be unlawful and a violation of this Part for any person:

- A. To park a vehicle across any such line or marking;
- B. To park a vehicle in such a position that the vehicle shall not be within the area so delineated by the lines or markings; or
- C. To park a vehicle elsewhere in any such lot than in an individual parking space adjacent to a parking meter.

§605. Manner of Parking at Meters.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle in any metered parking lot:

- A. Otherwise than with the front of the parked vehicle nearest to the parking meter applicable to that vehicle;
- B. With any part of the vehicle touching the meter post or head or the raised base or barrier on which meters are erected; or
- C. In any place other than a marked parking space or in any prohibited area, including access and exit driveways and turning and maneuvering spaces.

§606. Coin/Token Deposit in Meter; Overtime Parking Unlawful.

Whenever a vehicle is to be parked in any of the said parking lots, at any time during which the parking meters therein shall be in operation, the operator of such vehicle shall, upon entering a parking space adjacent to a parking meter, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited in such parking meter one or more coins of the United States or approved tokens as shall be specified in the legend upon such parking meter. Upon the deposit of such coin(s) or token(s) and placing the meter in operation, such parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle for the length of time designated by §601 for parking in said lot. If any vehicle shall remain in any such parking space for such length of time that the meter shall indicate by a proper signal that the lawful parking time shall have expired, such vehicle shall be considered as having been parked over-time, and the parking of a vehicle over time shall be a violation of this Part. Every hour that a vehicle shall remain parked at a meter showing a violation shall constitute a separate violation of this Part.

§607. Unlawful to Deposit Substitute for Coin in Meter.

It shall be unlawful for any person to deposit in any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part any slug or other substitute for a coin of the United States of America or approved token.

§608. Coin(s) or Token(s) Not Required.

Coin(s) or token(s) are not required when a proper permit is obtained and parking is at specified areas designated in §601 of this Part. Coin(s) or token(s) are not required when St. Marys City Council waives requirements for parking.

§609. Unlawful to Remain Parked at a Meter Showing Violation.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to permit a vehicle to remain in a parking space adjacent to a parking meter installed under this Part when that meter displays a signal indicating that the vehicle has already been parked there beyond the period of time prescribed for that parking space or the time for which a coin(s) or token(s) was deposited in that meter for the parking of that vehicle.

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§610. Unlawful to Tamper with Meter.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to deface, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this Part; provided that nothing in this Section shall apply to the servicing or opening of parking meters by officers, employees or police officers of the City of St. Marys under the direction of the City Manager or City Council.

§611. Metered Parking Lots for Certain Types of Vehicles Only.

The metered parking lots established by this Part shall be for the use of passenger cars, passenger vans and pickup trucks only; and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any other type of vehicle in any of those lots.

§612. Ticketing of Vehicles Parked Unlawfully; Effect of Payment of Within 48 Hours.

1. It shall be the duty of the police officers and parking enforcement personnel of the City of St. Marys, acting in accordance with the direction of the Chief of Police, to report:
 - A. The number of each parking meter that indicates that a vehicle occupying the adjacent parking space is, or has been, parked in violation of any provision of this Part;
 - B. The date and hour of the violation;
 - C. The license number of the vehicle;
 - D. Any other facts, the knowledge of which is necessary for a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending the violation.
2. The police officer or other person making the report shall also place on or attach to the vehicle a notice to the owner or driver of the vehicle that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Part, and instructing the owner or driver that, if he will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay, for the use of the City, the sum set forth by City Council in the yearly fee schedule within 48 hours after the time of the notice, or will place the sum for violation of parking enclosed within the envelope provided, in any of the special parking fine boxes installed at various locations within the City of St. Marys, within that time limit, that act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine prescribed in §613(1) of this Part.

§613. Penalty for Violation.

1. Any person who violates any provision of this Part, with the exception of §610, and who fails to pay the fine set forth in §612, shall be cited within 15 days of the violation and, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$15, and costs.
2. Any person who violates any provision of §610 of this Part shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$600, and costs, and, in default of payment of fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than 30 days.

§614. Days and Hours Parking Meters in Operation and Parking Time Limits Apply.

Parking meters shall be operated by the deposit of a coin(s) or token(s) in the meter as prescribed by §606 of this Part. The parking rates for specified lengths of time shall apply from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. prevailing time, each day, except for Sundays and federal holidays.

§701. Unmetered Parking Lots Established.

The following are established as the unmetered parking lots operated by the City of St. Marys:

§702. Reserved Parking Spaces for Handicapped May be Provided.

City Council at its discretion, may provide, at convenient and suitable locations in one or more of the unmetered parking lots, reserved parking spaces for handicapped, and shall designate those spaces by appropriate signs. It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this Part, for any person to park in any such reserved parking space, any vehicle unless that vehicle bears or displays either: a "handicapped registration plate", a "handicapped parking placard; a "disabled veteran registration plate", or a "disabled veteran placard". Provided; all provisions, requirements and restrictions contained in the other Sections of this Part shall apply to vehicles lawfully parked in reserved parking spaces for handicapped.

§703. Unlawful to Park Overtime or When Lot Closed.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park a vehicle, or to allow a vehicle to remain parked in any unmetered parking lot:

- A. for longer than the maximum parking time prescribed by §701 of this Part;
or
- B. at any time when the lot is not in operation and is closed to public use.

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§704. Unmetered Lots for Certain Types of Vehicles.

The unmetered parking lots established by §701 of this Part shall be for the use of passenger cars, passenger vans and pickup trucks only, and it shall be unlawful for any person to park any other kind or class of vehicle in any such lot.

§705. Manner of Parking.

Every vehicle parked in an unmetered parking lot shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding or marking the individual parking space assigned to that vehicle, and shall be parked headed into the parking space. It shall be unlawful for any person:

- A. to park a vehicle in a space not rented by him;
- B. to park a vehicle otherwise than as required by this Section; or
- C. to park a vehicle elsewhere than in an individual parking space, the prohibited areas including, but not limited to, the access and exit driveways and turning and maneuvering spaces.

§706. Parking on Rental Basis Only.

The parking spaces in the unmetered parking lots shall be available for parking on a monthly rental basis only. The rental fee shall be fixed by City Council pursuant to a resolution and shall be for a calendar month or the part of a calendar month remaining after the rental arrangements are made. The rental fee shall be paid in advance to the St. Marys City Police Department, for the use of the City of St. Marys, and after the first month shall be automatically renewable until the renter notifies the City of St. Marys that he wishes to terminate the rental arrangement. At any time, however, the City of St. Marys may, by amending §701 of this Part, discontinue provision of a specific unmetered parking lot or a portion of the parking spaces in any such lot, or may change any unmetered parking lot, or part of an unmetered parking lot, to a metered parking lot or to metered parking spaces. The rental parking spaces shall be assigned by the St. Marys City Police Department. The name of the renter of a parking space and/or the numbers and/or letters on the registration tag of the vehicle entitled to be parked there shall be posted by the City of St. Marys at the rental space or shall be painted on the surface of that parking space.

§707. Penalty for Violation.

1. The police officer or other person making the report shall also place on or attach to the vehicle a notice to the owner or driver of the vehicle that the vehicle was parked in violation of this Part, and instructing the owner or driver that if he will report to the office of the Chief of Police and pay, for the use of the City, the sum of two dollars (\$2.00) (five dollars (\$5.00) for violation of no parking 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.) within forty-eight (48) hours after the time of the notice, or will place the sum of two dollars (\$2.00) (five dollars (\$5.00) for violation 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. zones) enclosed within the envelope provided, in any of the special parking fine boxes installed at various locations within the City, within that time limit, that act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine prescribed in subsection (2) hereof.
2. Any person who violates any provision of this Part and who fails to pay the fine set forth in this §707, shall be cited within fifteen (15) days of the violation and upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) and costs.
3. Any person who violates §702 of this Part shall, upon summary conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs. This penalty shall be in lieu of any penalties which might otherwise be prescribed under subsections (1) and (2), above.

Part 8

Removal and Impoundment of Illegally Parked Vehicles

§801. Applicability and Scope.

This Part is enacted under authority of §6109 (a-22) of the Vehicle Code, and gives authority to the City of St. Marys to remove and impound those vehicles which are parked in a tow away zone and in violation of parking regulations of this Chapter. Vehicles which have been abandoned (as defined by the Vehicle Code) or which are parked in such a manner as to interfere with traffic or pose a hazard to others, may be towed under the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

§802. Authority to Remove and Impound.

The City of St. Marys shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in §801 of this Part. Provided, no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part, or the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

§803. Tow Away Zones Designated.

The following designated streets and/or parking lots are hereby established as tow-away zones. Signs shall be posted to place the public on notice that their vehicles may be towed for violation of the City of St. Marys parking regulations:

§804. Designation of Approved Storage Garages; Bonding; Towing and Storage.

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this Part shall be done only by "approved storage garages" that shall be designated from time to time by City Council. Every such garage shall submit evidence to City Council that it is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to City Council as sufficient to indemnify owners of

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impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garage keeper for the purpose of towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to City Council its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this Part, and, when the schedule is approved by City Council, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage; no different schedule of charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this Part by any approved storage garage. City Council shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this Part.

§805. Payment of Towing and Storage Charges.

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Part for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§806. Reclamation Costs.

In order to reclaim his vehicle, the owner shall pay towing and storage costs, plus a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) fee of which ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be transferred to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation by the garage to which the vehicle was taken.

§807. Records of Vehicles Removed and Impounded.

The City of St. Marys shall cause a record to be kept of all vehicles impounded under this Part and shall be able at all reasonable times to furnish the owners or the agents of the owners of those vehicles with information as to the place of storage of the vehicle.

§808. Restrictions upon Removal of Vehicles.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Part or the Vehicle Code if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.

§809. Penalty for Violation.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) together with all costs of disposing of the vehicle under provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 P.S. §7301 et seq. (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

§810. Reports and Disposition of Unclaimed Vehicles.

If after a period of fifteen (15) days the vehicle in storage remains unclaimed, a report shall be filed with PennDOT in accordance with §7311 of The Vehicle Code, by the person having legal custody of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been claimed after thirty (30) days, the vehicle may be transferred to a licensed Salvor who will then be responsible for filing the proper reports and disposing of the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code (75 Pa C.S.A. §110 et seq., as amended).

Part 9

Snow and Ice Emergency

§901. Declaration of Snow Emergency.

In order to facilitate the movement of traffic and the removal of large accumulations of snow and ice on City streets, the City Manager shall have the authority to declare a snow emergency within designated areas or on designated streets within the City. In the absence of the City Manager, the power to declare a snow emergency may be exercised by the Mayor. Public notice of the declaration and location of a snow emergency shall be made by broadcast on one or more radio and television stations service the City. Where time and circumstances permit, public notice shall also be provided in a newspaper of general circulation within the City.

§902. Time Declaration Takes Effect.

A declaration of snow emergency shall take effect at the time set forth in the declaration, which shall be not less than two (2) hours after the public notice is first published, whether by radio, television and newspaper. The declaration shall remain in effect until revoked by the City Manager or the Mayor by similar publication.

§903. Designation of Snow Emergency Areas.

The public notice of declaration of a snow emergency shall specify the area of streets affected by the emergency. The declaration shall also specify the activities prohibited within or upon the snow emergency areas or streets.

§904. Prohibited Activities.

No person shall park a motor vehicle on any part of any public street on which a snow emergency has been declared. Where prohibited by the snow emergency declaration, no person shall operate any motor vehicle on any street within the snow emergency area.

§905. Standards for Declaring a Snow Emergency.

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1. In determining whether to declare a snow emergency, the City Manager shall consider any one or more of the following criteria:
 - A. The accumulation of snow and ice along or within the public streets substantially interferes with the safe movement of traffic and pedestrians.
 - B. The existence of vehicles parked on public streets substantially interferes with the efforts of the Street Department to clear or remove the accumulation of snow and ice.
 - C. The continued operation of motor vehicles on the designated streets substantially increases the potential for property damage and personal injuries due to motor vehicle accidents.
2. The City Manager shall have the power to declare a snow emergency in advance of the occurrence of a storm which is likely to create conditions which require the City Street Department to immediately plow or remove the snow or ice.

§906. Authorization for Towing.

The City Manager and the City Police Department shall have the authority to tow any vehicles parked in violation of the snow emergency designation. The cost of towing shall be assessed against the owner of the vehicle and may be collected as part of any summary proceeding or civil enforcement action relating to the violation.

§907. Penalties.

Any person who parks or operates a motor vehicle in violation of this Part shall be subject to a penalty as provided in Chapter 15, Part 1, §104, of the St. Marys Code, together with the cost of removal or towing of the vehicle.

Part 10

Regulation of Pedalcycles and Non-motorized Vehicles

§1001. Riding and Parking of Pedalcycles on Sidewalks Along Certain Streets Prohibited.

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride or to park a pedalcycle on the sidewalk along the following portions of the streets in the City of St. Marys:

- 2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of five dollars (\$5.00) and costs.

§1002. Restrictions on Use of Pushcarts.

- 1. The word "pushcart", as used in this Section, shall mean a vehicle, including a pedalcycle, propelled solely by human power, and used or intended for use for the display, transport, exhibit or sale of goods, wares or merchandise.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to propel a pushcart upon any sidewalk in any business district except as necessary to move the pushcart to a location from which it is to be loaded or unloaded or from which goods, wares or merchandise are to be sold or dispensed under permit from City Clerk as provided in subsection (3) of this Section.
- 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to park a pushcart upon any sidewalk except for the purpose of selling or dispensing from that pushcart goods, wares or merchandise to passersby under permit from City Council. Every such permit shall be issued to the person making application for the permit, upon payment of a fee, which shall be for the use of the City of St. Marys, set by the City Council pursuant to resolution of the City Council. The permit shall be granted to the applicant, upon payment of the fee, and upon his signing an agreement with City Council that he shall be bound by the conditions imposed by City Council and made a part of the permit, dealing with the following matters:
 - A. Restricting or limiting the parking of the pushcart to one (1) or more stated locations upon the sidewalk and to stated days and hours at each location;
 - B. Stating requirements to be adhered to in connection with the disposal of garbage and refuse resulting from the operations carried on;

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- C. Requiring that there be no violation of any law, Chapter or regulation pertaining to health, sanitation and the handling of food or drink.
4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section, or any condition of any permit granted under this Section, shall be guilty of a summary offense, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and costs.

§1003. Skateboards, Rollerskates, In-line Skates, Coasters, Sleds and Other Toy Vehicles.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or ride on any skateboard, rollerskates, in-line skates, coasters, sleds or other toy vehicles upon any public street or public parking lot within the City, except for any portion of a street blocked off for sledging by authority of §105 of Part 1 or §216 of Part 2 of this Chapter.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or ride on any skateboard, rollerskates, in-line skates, coasters, sleds or other toy vehicles in any public park in the City, except in areas specifically designated for such purposes.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to use or ride on any skateboard, rollerskates, in-line skates, coasters, sleds or other toy vehicles on any sidewalk located in any commercial district in the City except that a pedestrian may pull a sled or other toy vehicle, with or without a rider.
4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of five dollars (\$5.00) and costs.

§1004. Bicycle Operation Regulations.

Every license issued hereunder shall be deemed to be granted subject to the following conditions:

- A. Every bicycle operated from sunset until visible sunrise shall be equipped with a lamp exhibiting a white light visible for a distance of at least five hundred (500) feet to the front and with lamp or reflector on the rear exhibiting a red or yellow light and with red or yellow side reflectors.
- B. No bicycle shall be operated unless it is in safe mechanical condition and in good working order at all times.

- C. No bicycle shall be operated on any public sidewalk in any commercially zoned district.
- D. Every bicycle when operated on a public highway shall be kept as close to the right hand curb as possible and shall be operated in single file only. The riding of bicycles in circles shall be prohibited. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons riding a bicycle to cling or to attach themselves to any other moving vehicle.
- E. The operator of a bicycle shall not carry another person on the bicycle when operating such bicycle upon any highway or park property in the City of St. Marys nor shall the operator of any such bicycle tow or draw any coaster, sled, person on roller skates, skateboard, toy vehicle or other similar vehicle on any public highway. Bicycles designed to be operated by two (2) or more persons may be so operated.
- F. No bicycle shall be ridden faster than is reasonable and every bicycle shall be operated with reasonable regard to the highways or park property of the City.
- G. All persons operating a bicycle shall observe traffic lights and stop signs, and all vehicular traffic laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and the ordinance of the City of St. Marys.
- H. The operator of a bicycle shall not carry any parcels unless they are strapped to the frame of the bicycle or placed in a parcel carrier.
- I. No rider of any bicycle shall remove both hands from the handle bars or both feet from the pedals, or otherwise operate a bicycle in a careless or reckless manner so as to endanger himself or other persons upon the public highways or park property of the City.

Part 11

Pedestrian Regulations

§1101. Pedestrians to Obey Traffic-Control Signs.

At all locations in the City of St. Marys where official traffic-control signals are installed, pedestrians, except where directed otherwise by pedestrian-control signals installed under §1102 of this Part, shall obey the directions of those traffic-control signals, as follows:

- A. When facing a green signal, a pedestrian may proceed across the roadway within a crosswalk;
- B. When facing a steady yellow signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway;
- C. When facing a steady red signal, a pedestrian shall not enter the roadway.

§1102. Pedestrian-Control Signal Locations Established.

At the following locations, official pedestrian-control signals shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected):

Street	Intersection	Direction of Travel
Brusselles St.	John St.	Both
State Route No. 120 West	Entrance to Keystone Carbon Company	Both

Every pedestrian facing a steady or flashing "Don't Walk" signal shall obey the directions of that signal, as follows:

- A. When facing a steady "Don't Walk" signal, a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway in the direction of the signal, but any pedestrian who has partially completed his crossing on the "Walk" signal should proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone while the "Don't Walk" signal is showing.
- B. When facing a flashing "Don't Walk" signal a pedestrian shall not start to cross the roadway in the direction of the indication, but any pedestrian who has partly completed crossing during the "Walk" indication should proceed to a sidewalk or safety zone.

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Any pedestrian who fails to obey the directions of a Don't Walk" signal, as indicated above, shall be guilty of an offense and a violation of this Part.

§1103. Locations Where Pedestrian Crossing in Unmarked Crosswalks Restricted.

Except when authorized by a police officer or other appropriately attired person authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic, it shall be unlawful for any pedestrian to cross the roadway at any of the following streets, at the intersection with that street indicated.

§1104. Locations Where Pedestrians May Cross Only in Crosswalk.

It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian:

- A. To cross any roadway in a business district within the City of St. Marys except in a crosswalk;
- B. To cross the roadway, in any of the following portions of streets in the City of St. Marys, except in a crosswalk:

Provided: nothing in this section shall permit any pedestrian to cross in a crosswalk at any location where that crossing is prohibited by §1102 of this Part.

§1105. Penalty for Violation.

Any pedestrian who violates any provision of this Part shall be guilty of a summary offense, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of five dollars (\$5.00) and costs.

Part 12

Handicapped Parking

§1201. Post of Reserved Parking Spaces for Handicapped Persons and Disabled Veterans.

Where a property owner is required by law to provide parking areas for handicapped persons and severely disabled veterans, the property owner shall post said parking areas in accordance with regulations issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, 67 Pa. Code §217.4(c), as from time to time amended. The property owner shall also post a sign advising motorists of the amount of the fine.

§1202. Prohibition Against Illegal Parking.

No person shall cause or permit a motor vehicle to be parked in a reserved parking area for handicapped persons or severely disabled veterans unless such vehicle possesses a handicapped or disabled veteran registration or a handicapped parking placard issued in accordance with the regulations of the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, which registration or placard is visibly displayed on or in the motor vehicle.

§1203. Penalty for Violation.

1. Any property owner who fails or neglects to properly post and maintain proper posting of reserved parking spaces for handicapped persons and severely disabled veterans shall, upon summary conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs.
2. Any person who violates §1202 of this Part shall, upon summary conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of fifty dollars (\$50.00) and costs.
